

Sergey Dogadin, Violine



Sergey Dogadin is one of the most promising violinists of his generation, who has proven his talent in numerous renowned competitions. Thus he has won two prizes at the Moscow Tchaikovsky Competition in 2011, the International Joseph Joachim Competition in Hanover in 2015 and the Isaac Stern International Violin Competition Shanghai in 2016. Sergey Dogadin was awarded two special prizes at the ARD International Music Competition in 2009. In 2018 he won the Singapore International Violin Competition with his interpretation of Tchaikovsky's Violin Concerto.

Since his debut at the St. Petersburg Philharmonic under Vasily Petrenko in 2002, Sergey Dogadin has been engaged in a lively concert activity that has taken him to the world's most important concert halls. There he performed together with renowned musicians such as Yuri Temirkanov, Valery Gergiev, Vladimir Ashkenazy, Daniil Trifonov, Vladimir Spivakov, Nikolai Tokarev, Yuri Simonov, Wassili Petrenko, Anu Tali, Muhai Tang, Ken-David Masur, Kevin Griffiths, Michael Francis, Fabio Mastrangelo or Michał Nesterowicz and gave concerts with numerous orchestras including the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra, the London Philharmonic Orchestra, the Munich Philharmonic, the NDR Radiophilharmonie, the National Orchestras of Estonia and Lithuania, the Nordic Symphony Orchestra, Kremerata Baltica, the Budapest Symphony Orchestra, the Taipei Symphony Orchestra, the Russian National Orchestra and the Saint Petersburg Philharmonic Orchestra.

In addition, Sergey Dogadin has appeared at numerous festivals among them the *Star of the White Nights* and *Musical Olympus* in Saint Petersburg, the Colmar International Festival, the Baden-Baden Festival, the Schleswig-Holstein Music Festival and the Baltic Sea Festival.

In 2008 Sergey Dogadin released his debut album (Solo Musica) with works by Tchaikovsky, Rachmaninov, Prokofiev and Rosenblatt. In 2016 he recorded his second CD (Naxos) with works by Shostakovich together with the pianist Nikolai Tokarev.

Sergey Dogadin was born in 1988 to a family of traditional musicians in St. Petersburg. He began playing the violin at the age of 5 with the renowned teacher Lev Ivashchenko. In 2012 Sergey Dogadin completed his studies at the St. Petersburg Conservatory under Vladimir Ovcharek. Further studies followed from 2012–2014 at the HfMT Cologne with Mihaela Martin and from 2013–2015 at the Kunstuniversität Graz with Boris Kuschnir. In 2015 he continued his studies with Boris Kuschnir at MUK University in Vienna. Sergey Dogadin received further musical impulses in master classes with Maxim Vengerov and Zakhar Bron, among others. Sergey Dogadin is a scholarship holder of the Russian Ministry of Culture, the *Yuri Temirkanov Prize*, the *Prize of the President of the Russian Federation*, the Mozart Society Dortmund and the Werner Richard - Dr. Carl Dörken Foundation.

He currently plays a violin by Giovanni Battista Guadagnini (Parma, 1765), which was made available to him by the *Fritz Behrens Foundation* in Hanover.
